Who I Am

- Of the people: my life experiences are more like yours than like most politicians'
  - Grew up poorer than most members of Congress
  - Worked on the family farm from the age of 6
- Labels
  - Unhelpful labels: liberal, conservative, radical
  - More important to know about me: independent thinker, open-minded, prefer to listen rather than talk, pragmatist, realist, optimist
  - Labels I accept: Christian, engineer

Why I'm Running

- Restore trust: hard to find the truth in the information avalanche
- Restore confidence: truth telling, common decency, common sense, respect for people's dignity
- Restore unity: stop anti-government rhetoric and disparagement of public servants for political gain, and instead focus on common ground, common goals to move forward

Transition: common ground on three important issues facing Oklahomans

## Leadership: Health Care

- Problems:
  - Oklahomans have poorer health outcomes than most states in the US (lack of access to health care/affordable health care)
  - 42 Oklahoma rural hospitals and as many as half of our nursing homes are closing
  - ongoing insurance market instability means that Oklahomans pay more for health insurance than most in the US
  - US has more than double the maternal mortality rate of any other country in the developed world, and the US is the only developed country with increasing mortality rates (US rate is 26.4%, next highest country is UK with 9.2%)
  - US babies are less likely to survive their first year than babies in other developed countries: 3x more likely to die from extreme immaturity and 2.3x more likely to die from SIDS
  - These problems are worse in rural areas where people are far away from hospitals, especially when rural hospitals are closing
  - Solutions:
    - Expand Medicaid
      - \$900 million/year in federal funding, \$100 million/year state matching funds
      - boost the economy
      - save hospitals and nursing homes
    - Fix PPACA
      - restore insurance market stability
      - amend the parts that need improvement
      - healthier insureds balance the cost for sicker insureds

Leadership: 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment

- Problems:
  - in 2018, 373 people were killed and 1,347 wounded in 340 mass shootings in the US

- firearm suicides account for more than half of suicides in the US and in Oklahoma, and
- more gun deaths are the result of suicide than of homicide
- Solutions: sensible gun laws
  - provide for responsible gun ownership and protect people when they're vulnerable
  - red flag laws

Leadership: climate change

- Problems:
  - implications for Oklahoma are significant
  - greater drought frequency and severity
  - increased risk of wildfires
  - more intense individual rainfall events
  - more runoff and flash flooding
- Solutions:
  - the best scientific information, including support for research in Oklahoma and around the country
  - leadership willing to speak truthfully about the issues
  - courage to make difficult choices
  - commitment to resolving the problems

- Congress is an equal branch of government, must act independently of the executive branch
